Abstract: Revitalizing Toronto's waterfront is the largest urban renewal project currently underway in North America and one of the world's largest waterfront revitalization initiatives. Waterfront Toronto is the tri-government funded corporation with a 25-year mandate to transform 800 hectares of waterfront brown field lands into Toronto's New Blue Edge - beautiful, accessible, sustainable mixed-use communities and dynamic public spaces.

Learn how Waterfront Toronto is bringing together sustainable development, excellence in urban design, real estate development, leading technology infrastructure and the delivery of important public policy objectives in revitalizing Toronto's waterfront. David Kusturin, Waterfront Toronto's Vice President, Program Management, will also offer a status report on revitalization progress to date, identify opportunities for geotechnical consultants and provide a look ahead to upcoming revitalization projects across the waterfront.

Speaker: Mr. David Kusturin is Vice President, Program Management for Waterfront Toronto where he is responsible for developing and managing the corporation's capital investment plan, budget and schedule. The \$25 billion revitalization of Toronto's waterfront is one of the largest urban renewal initiatives in the world. David brings 25 years of real estate development and project management experience to this role, having previously held senior management positions at Cushman and Wakefield LePage and CB Richard Ellis, directing the operations of their global project management organizations. He has a Bachelor of Technology, Architectural Science from Ryerson University and is married with two children.
